COUNCIL RESOLUTION: 22-06

Grant Program on Environmental Justice and Climate Change Resilience in North America (EJ4Climate)

THE COUNCIL:

RECALLING Council Resolution 21-04 that established the Grant Program on Environmental Justice and Climate Change Resilience in North America (EJ4Climate);

RECOGNIZING the Parties' sustained commitment to work together with underserved and vulnerable communities, and Indigenous communities, in Canada, Mexico, and the United States to prepare them for climate-related impacts;

EMPHASIZING that continuing with the EJ4Climate grant program will allow the Commission for Environmental Cooperation (CEC) to fund directly community-based organizations to help them develop community-driven solutions to adapt to the impacts of climate change while addressing environmental justice concerns6

CONVINCED that our governments can spur transformational innovations, conserve nature, build resilience, strengthen climate adaptation, and drive economic growth for communities across North America;

NOTING that on 15 July 2022, during the 29th Council Session, the United States announced its intention to transfer US\$1,000,000 to the CEC to continue the EJ4Climate grant program;

CONSIDERING that Article 12 of the Agreement on Environmental Cooperation states that the annual budget may be supplemented through funding or in-kind contributions from the Parties, unless the Council decides otherwise;

NOTING that Canada and Mexico support the United States' intentions to supplement the budget of the CEC;

ACKNOWLEDGING that the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Executive Director of the CEC will sign an agreement for the transfer of funds;

HEREBY DECIDES TO:

INSTRUCT the Secretariat to allocate the United States' supplemental contribution to the EJ4Climate grant program;

AUTHORIZE, consistent with the CEC Council Rules of Procedure and the Financial Rules, that an amount not to exceed US\$1,000,000 from the unrestricted CEC surplus funds be transferred to further support the EJ4Climate grant program; while

REAFFIRMING that at the end of the grant program, the use of any unspent funds will require approval from the Council;
