Abstract

As part of the North American TEK Atlas project, the present guide is a companion to the Inventory of CEC initiatives that have included Indigenous engagement. This inventory spans the entire history of CEC activities, from 1995 to December 2018. It involved keyword-based research from the CEC website and publication archives as well as discussions with CEC Secretariat staff to identify most initiatives.

Classified under five different categories (Event/Public Consultation, Grant, Program/Project, Publication/Report, and Submission), nearly 150 initiatives were identified since the creation of the CEC. From all of these initiatives, 470 different Indigenous representatives/groups/communities/associations were identified from Canada (36%), Mexico (41.5%), the United States (22%), as well as binational ones from Canada/United States (0.5%).

A brief analysis of the inventory indicates a frequent but uneven engagement of Indigenous communities in the initiatives of the CEC over the years. This suggests a need for better integration of Indigenous engagement to minimize fluctuations in upcoming years.

Findings on the limitations of this inventory and recommendations were included in the guide to help subsequent work on the topic of Indigenous engagement, and ensure the optimal use of the inventory.

Preface

The CEC Council has acknowledged the importance of enhancing the participation of Indigenous communities in CEC initiatives, and the value of Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK) in informing the work of the CEC. Building on the creation of the TEK Expert Group (TEKEG) in 2016, the North American TEK Atlas project aims to advance the engagement of TEK and Indigenous communities by initially (Activity #1) compiling a list of existing engagement frameworks and projects with participation from Indigenous and local communities. This compilation will serve as a resource to inform upcoming CEC work and facilitate enhanced engagement of Indigenous and local communities in CEC initiatives.

1. Introduction

As part of the North American TEK Atlas project (Activity 1), this guide is a companion to the inventory of CEC initiatives that have included the engagement of Indigenous communities. The inventory includes all of these initiatives, with or without explicit mention of TEK, in order to incorporate the different levels of engagement undertaken by the CEC since its creation. As described in the original project proposal, the outputs for the inventory are:

- 1.2.1 Inventory and summary of CEC initiatives with Indigenous engagement, including TEK, within the organization's history.
- 1.2.2 List of Indigenous and local communities who have currently or in the past engaged in CEC activities, through NAPECA grants or otherwise.

2. Methodology

- Review of the CEC website, especially previous CEC and JPAC events, to identify past initiatives involving Indigenous communities.
- Review of existing CEC reports related to the engagement of Indigenous communities in the work of the CEC.
- Research on published documentation on CEC's Virtual Library (<http://www3.cec.org/islandora/en>)
- Interviews with key staff at the CEC Secretariat on past and current initiatives involving Indigenous communities.
- Keywords used when searching information on the CEC website: Indigenous, Tribal, First Nations, Traditional Ecological Knowledge, TEK, Inuit, Native, and Aboriginal. (Note: We removed false positives in search results such as "Indigenous species" and "Native species").

3. Summary of results

The inventory regrouped highlighted initiatives under the following categories which were chosen to reflect the type of activity,

- **Event / Public Consultation:** All CEC initiatives which either involved a face-to-face meeting or a public call for an online consultation through its website. These events were organized by most of the CEC units (JPAC, Council, Projects, etc.)
- **Grants:** CEC grant programs over the years. Created in 1995, the North American Fund for Environmental Cooperation (NAFEC) ended in 2003. It was replaced at the end of 2011 by the North American Partnership for Environmental Community Action (NAPECA) which ended in 2018. Note: There was no grant program during 2004-2011.
- **Program / Project:** This category includes programs and projects which explicitly engaged Indigenous communities as part of their work. The SMOC program was noteworthy to be

highlighted since it engaged Indigenous communities during its decade long duration, and specific groups were identified through its underlying projects and events.

- **Publication / Report:** This includes publications and reports that specifically indicated the involvement of Indigenous communities in the development process of the publication. Indigenous communities were identified under this category when they participated directly in the elaboration of the reports (writing, review, commenting, etc.)
- **Submission:** Although few in numbers, initiatives under this category highlight when the Submissions on Enforcement Matters process involved Indigenous communities.

Overall and up until December 2018, 143 initiatives were identified since the creation of the CEC. Note that the current North American TEK Atlas project was not included to avoid self-referencing.

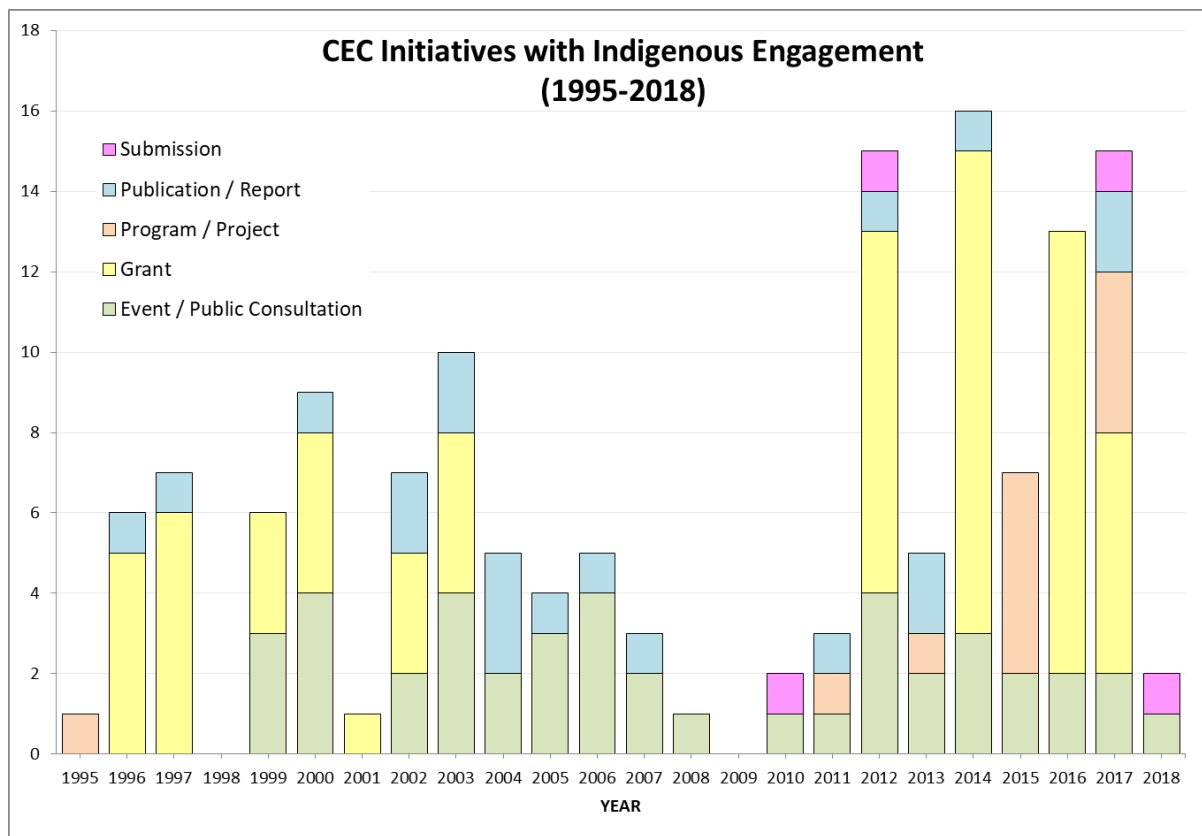


Figure 1. CEC Initiatives with Indigenous Engagement (1995-2018)

Figure 1 below shows the amount of initiatives identified every year. Detailed information on each initiative can be found in the inventory itself.

The “Grant” category was identified as the highest type of activity (45%) for the engagement of Indigenous communities in the CEC, through funding of community projects. Initiatives identified in this category also emphasizes the two distinct grant periods described above (1995-2003 and 2011-2018).

The “Event / Public Participation” category is identified as the second highest type of activity (30%) for engagement of Indigenous communities. Throughout the CEC history, this research shows there has been a constant engagement of Indigenous communities every year in events/meetings with the exception of the first years of the organization. This could be explained in part due to the annual

Regular Session of the CEC Council and JPAC meetings which often attract a large number of diverse stakeholders, including members of Indigenous communities.

The “Publication / Report” category accounted for 14% of identified initiatives. Indigenous communities were identified under this category when they participated directly in the elaboration of the reports (writing, review, commenting, etc.). This category involves the activities of many administrative units such as Programs/Projects for research reports, SEM unit for Factual Records, and Independent Reports led by the Executive Director.

At first glance, the “Program / Project” category seems to indicate a lower engagement (8%) of Indigenous communities in this type of activity, at least until 2015. It is worth noting that programs and project meetings that did engage Indigenous communities are captured under the “Event / Public Consultation” category. This indicates that although their descriptions might not officially indicate such engagement, programs and projects do engage Indigenous communities through some of their meetings and reports as indicated in the previous categories.

Under the “Submission” category (3%), the engagement of Indigenous communities in the Submission on Enforcement Matter process seems to be a relatively new phenomenon, as submissions involving Indigenous communities have been filed since 2010, and not before. It is worth noting that the CEC does not control this type of engagement due to the fact that the submissions process is initiated by the public.

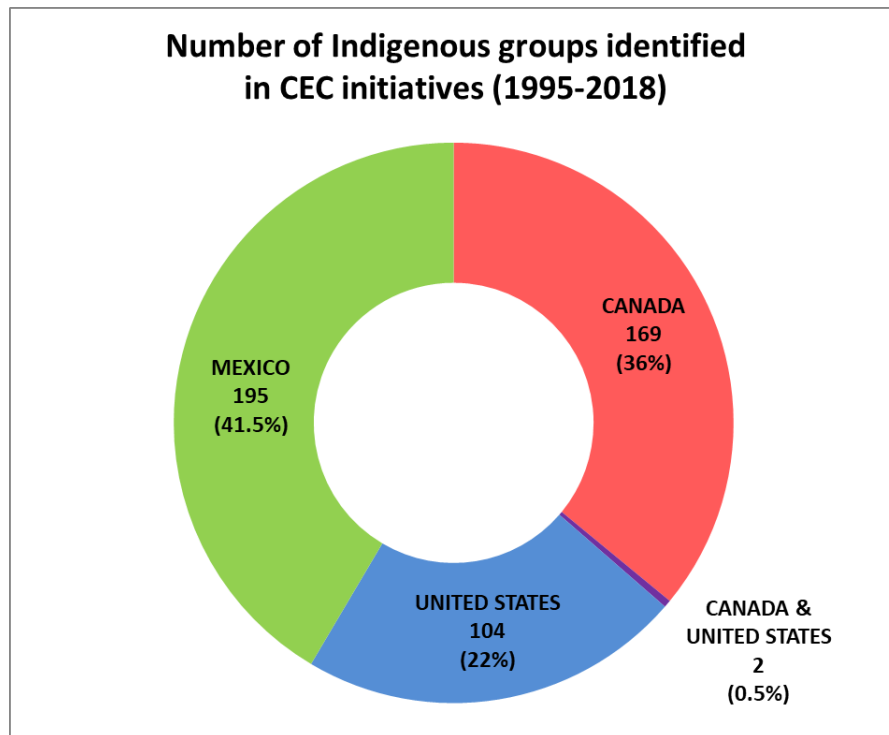


Figure 2. Number of Indigenous groups identified in CEC Initiatives (1995-2018)

In total, 470 Indigenous communities/groups were identified in this inventory, of which 169 from Canada, 195 from Mexico, 104 from the United States, and 2 groups related to both Canada & United States (see Figure 2 below). This represents the number of groups/associations/communities that were identified but not the amount of people they represent as some groups might represent a large number of individuals in a country, while others might represent a small local community.

4. Limitations

This inventory only includes Indigenous communities who self-identified as such, either through their position or their affiliation. The inventory does not include individuals that might identify as Indigenous, but who didn't report it during their engagement with the CEC (e.g. through registration forms, through presentations, etc.). These omissions in the inventory are more likely in the case of Mexico, where Indigenous representatives/communities/peoples do not necessarily identify themselves as members of official groups like First Nations in Canada and Indian Tribes in the United States. Some groups could be identified through project descriptions, but many could not due to a lack of information.

The different categories of initiatives (Submission, Publication/Report, etc.) are not mutually exclusive since they were chosen to reflect the type of activity. An "Event" initiative with Indigenous participants could have also been part of an overarching "Program/Project" initiative involving Indigenous researchers. As such, the total number of initiatives should be viewed as instances where Indigenous engagement occurred, but not necessarily as distinct activities.

5. Recommendations

Until recently, participants in public meetings did not have to self-identify as "Indigenous" when filling out a registration form. This made subsequent assessments on the engagement of Indigenous people quite difficult. As is currently the practice, the CEC should ensure that all registration forms include a field regarding the type of participant, e.g. Indigenous, Youth, Private Sector, etc. These categories will help the CEC performance and impact measurements, especially in terms of identifying the engagement of specific groups.

Even in the case of private working sessions, all participants should be registered under a specific type. This will allow the official list of participants to easily reflect the overall proportion of the different groups engaged, instead of solely relying on their position or affiliation to assess their affiliation to a specific group of stakeholders.

Considering the high amount of "Grant" initiatives which included the engagement of Indigenous communities, the NAPECA program, or a similar initiative, should be considered moving forward, particularly if the goal for the CEC is to further increase this type of engagement.

6. Conclusion

Over the years, many initiatives that were led by the CEC allowed Indigenous communities to engage in environmental cooperation. This inventory clearly demonstrates the efforts made, but on the other hand, it also reveals how this engagement fluctuated considerably over the years. The inventory should then be used as a tool to further strengthen and integrate this engagement in the future.
