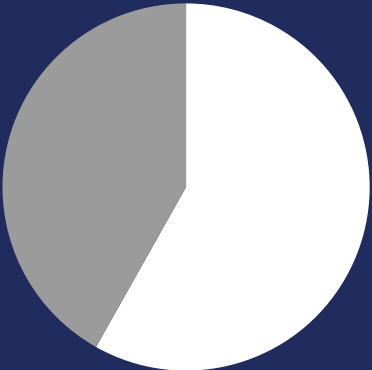
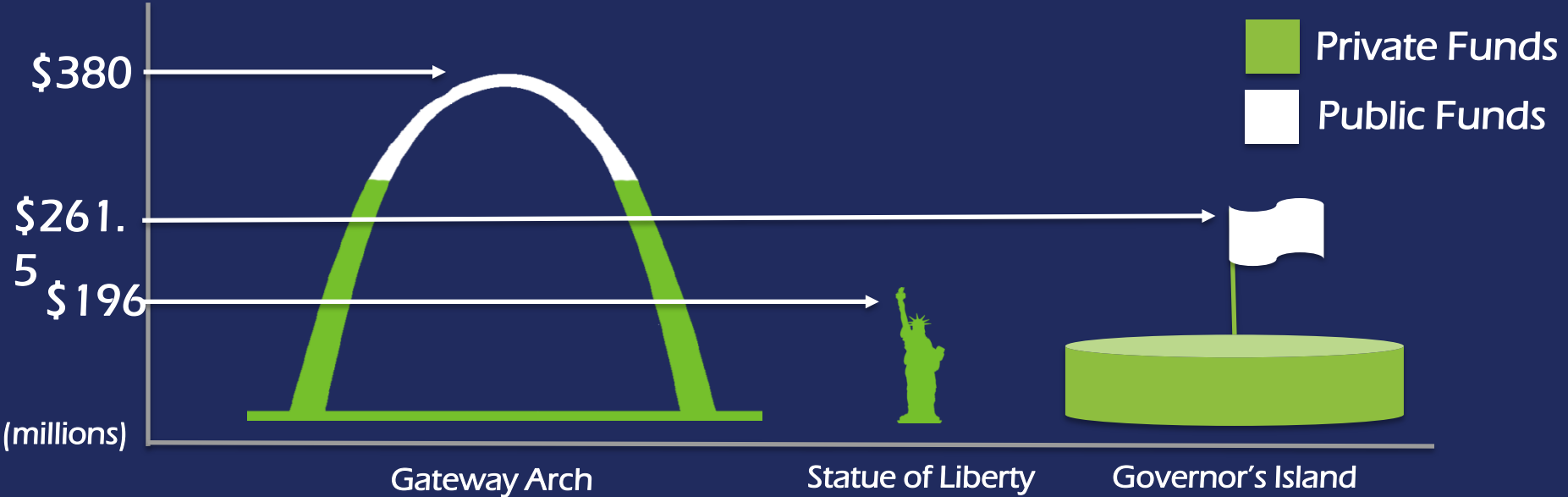

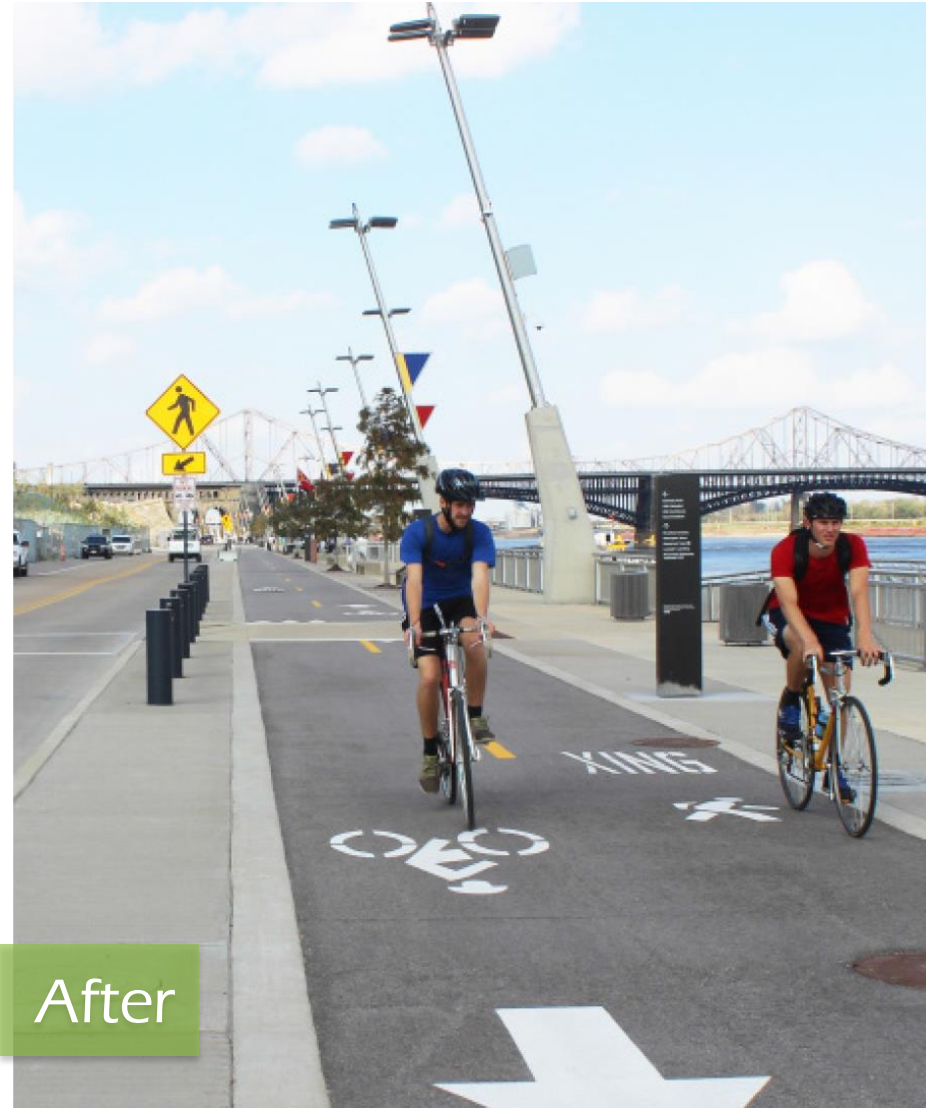

Project Update | Kiener Plaza – Over 7,500 attendees at opening May 19th & 20th



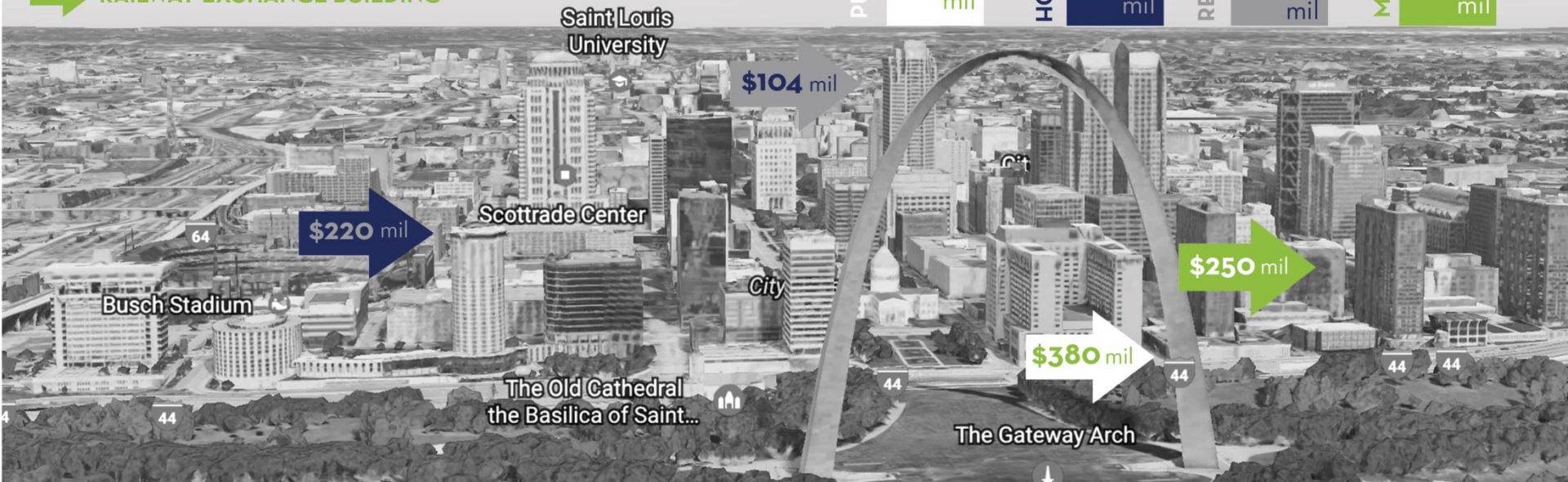

35,605 gallons of a Liquid Biological Amendment (compost tea) were added to the soil.

CityArchRiver Project brought the addition of 840 organically-raised London Plane trees to the grounds of the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial.



Radishes were planted to naturally aerate soil.



Storm water is stored in a cistern under Luther Ely Smith Square and then used for irrigation.

By raising the riverfront 30 inches, the project reclaimed 67% of days previously lost to flooding.

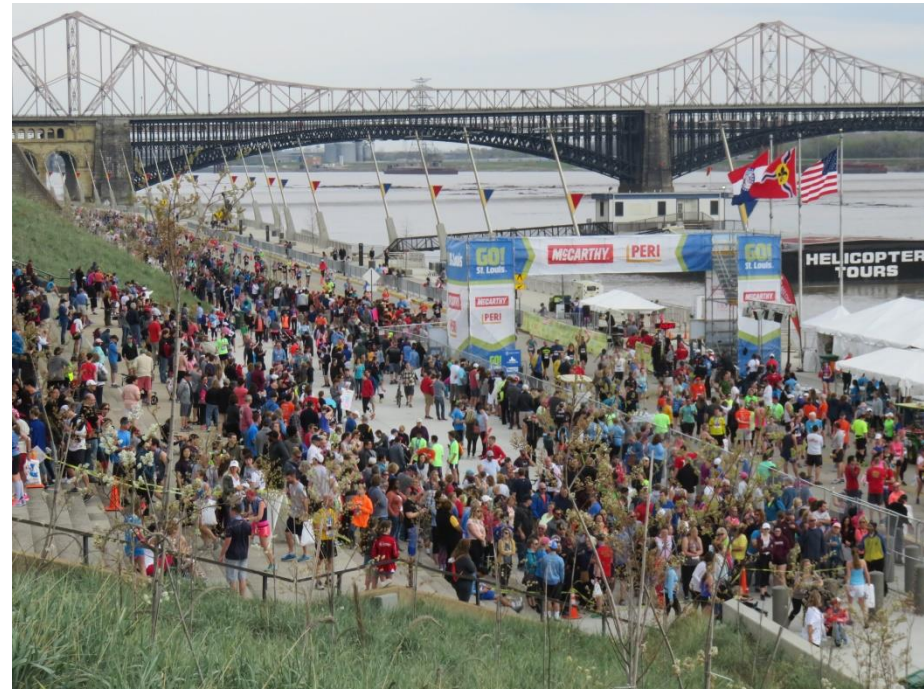
