# Canada, Mexico and the United States

The North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) was implemented in 1994 and included a parallel environmental agreement:

North American Agreement on Environmental Cooperation (NAAEC)








# The NAAEC

- First environmental agreement linked to a trade agreement.
- Commits the Parties to effective enforcement of environmental laws.
- Includes a consultation and dispute process (has never been used by the Parties).
- Creates the CEC and establishes a public submissions on enforcement matters (SEM) process.

# The CEC's Structure




# The Secretariat implements the work of the Commission

- Headed by Executive Director Cesar Rafael Chavez, appointed by Mexico in January 2016
- Cooperative work program
- Public submissions process on enforcement matters
- Secretariat's independent reports (Article 13)
- Grant-making: North American Partnership for Environmental Community Action (NAPECA)

# Public Submissions Process on Enforcement Matters (SEM)

- Fact-finding mechanism
- Transparency, public participation, and information sharing
- Enhances accountability
- Non-judicial, non-adversarial, and nonremedial

### **HOW IT WORKS: Overview**



Commission for Environmental Cooperation
Comisión para la Cooperación Ambiental

- A submission must be filed with the Secretariat
- Filed by any NGO established in or person residing in the territory of one of the NAAEC Parties.
- Must meet certain eligibility criteria
- If it does, the Secretariat requests a Party response

## **HOW IT WORKS: After a Party Response**

- Secretariat reviews and determines whether to recommend a FR.
- The Council votes yes or no.
- The Secretariat then prepares a FR, if authorized to do so.

## **Submissions on Enforcement Matters (SEM)**

#### Total of 88 submissions to date

- 45 Mexico
- 30 Canada
- 12 United States
- 1 Canada-United States
- 2 submissions currently active
- 22 Factual Records published to date

# Most Prevalent Laws cited in Submissions



## **Rates of Submissions**

- Average of 5 submissions per year.
- Submissions since 2012:
  - 2 Canadian
  - 3 US
  - 5 Mexican

Currently, we have 2 active Mexican submissions

#### 88 Submissions

 22 Factual Records (from 24 submissions) have been Authorized by Council

#### Of the 62 other submissions (exclusive of 2 active):

- 25 found by Secretariat not to meet eligibility criteria
- 4 submissions found not to have pursued private remedies
- 3 were the subject of pending proceedings
- 18 have been found by Secretariat not to merit the the production of a Factual Record
- 7 have been terminated by Council votes
- 5 have been withdrawn

# **Factual Records**

- 12 Mexican Factual Records
- 8 Canadian Factual Records
- 2 US Factual Records
- The last Canadian Factual Record was Quebec Automobiles (2012, from a 2004 submission)
- The last US Factual Record was Coal Fired Power Plants (2014, from a 2004 submission)
- The last Mexican Factual Record was Sumidero Canyon (2015, from a 2010 submission)
