



- Minimization
- Treatment

MINIMIZATION STRATEGIES

Green Homes

Rosario has 2,650 Green Homes, where 65% of them do home composting.



Green Schools Network

In 2015 we began doing composting in schools where 25 institutions joined the program (Total: 320)





TREATMENT STRATEGIES

Background - MBT Compost Plant

Operational since 2013

Built with the contribution of the National Secretary of the Environment and the World Bank.











In 2015 Rosario was selected by the World Bank to be consulted (along with 2 other cities in Argentina: Mar del Plata and Salta) to develop a food waste management strategy:

- Technical Consulting
- Regulatory Consulting
- Communication Consulting

TECHNICAL ASPECT



The plant receives 6tn organic wastes per day from the Fisherton Market, which are mixed with garden cuttings to obtain better quality compost.

New strategic partnerships

This week an agreement between the Civil Association BAR and the Fruit and Vegetable Producers Market was signed in order to work on the redistribution of food for charity purposes.

Diminution of Food Loss and Waste National Program

On September, 2016 Rosario joined the Diminution of Food Loss and Waste National Network.



Decree Nº 2,249: The Mayor ratifies adhesion to the National Program

Municipal Ordinance Nº9,558

In June 2016 a Municipal Ordinance was passed. It claims it is mandatory for all gastronomic establishments to make available to the customers the food that was not consumed in the premises.

Decree Nº45,676

Orders the Municipal Executive to carry out campaigns encouraging the customers to request the food that was not consumed in the gastronomic establishments.

More than 3,500 people have visited the Composting and Treatment Plant since 2015



Next Challenges

- Good Practices Manual: consumer guide with useful recommendations to handling, buying, consuming and disposing of food.
- Communication campaign joined with big waste producers, in order to promote planning and organizing grocery shopping according to family consumption.

Next Challenges

- Organic Waste Collection in 3 neighborhoods.
- Incorporate new technology to the Plant to optimize energy use of the processed waste.
