


Big Bend-Río Bravo Area of Binational Interest for Conservation

CEC Project: two main components

- ✓ Conservation of biological diversity in the Big Bend-Río Bravo region
 - Challenges to ecosystem resilience
 - Model of collaboration for transboundary conservation
- ✓ Allow extension of data-sharing protocols and best management practices to deal with invasive species

Project activities

- Expand existing conservation partnership to include more partners in Mexico and to increase the ability to coordinate and implement conservation efforts in the US and Mexico.
- Develop a science-based binational conservation strategy for rehabilitation of the Rio Grande/Río Bravo.
- Replicate experience on transboundary conservation in future projects and initiatives in the North American Region.
- Facilitate the development of sustainable economic and social tools for integrating the local communities of Boquillas, Coahuila, Mexico, and others along the border.
- Expand strategic planning, implementation of exotic and invasive species' management and a web-based information sharing.
- Implement community-based prevention, early detection-rapid response, and management to deal with invasive species.
