Launched in the 1990s, the Environmental Stewardship Program was created to empower Native American and Alaska Native youth with the tools and knowledge to protect and preserve their homelands. Through hands-on training and educational workshops, young participants:

- Gain a deeper understanding of environmental issues impacting Native communities
- Develop leadership skills to serve as ambassadors for environmental awareness
- Promote sustainable solutions to protect the environmental health of Native lands

This program continues to inspire the next generation of Native leaders dedicated to environmental justice and cultural preservation.



Garth Ambassaclor Platform OVERVIEW

This program aims to braid sustainable practices, education, and traditional ecological knowledge.

Traditional ecological Yoeme knowledge has and will continue to be crucial to our Yaqui way of life. Traditional teachings provide a myriad of resources, such as their incorporation in our medicine, ceremonies, prayers, and more.

This program is an intergenerational experience where tribal members journey to various cultural plant sites growing within our communities. At the site they learn the traditional names, uses and history of the plants. Then they sustainably harvest the plant to create a cultural recipe, remedy, or cultural item.

- **5.** Ensure that Yoeme cultural and traditional teachings are practiced within our current and future generations.
