As a follow up to the letter dated November 23th, 2020, and the message EUA00351R dated February 2nd, 2021, regarding the request for comparability findings for fisheries in the Upper Gulf of California, and to advance this process, the Embassy of Mexico to the United States sends hereby the document "AGREEMENT establishing the indicators, detonating factors and predetermined actions, in accordance with article seventeen of the Agreement regulating fishing gears, systems, methods, techniques and schedules for carrying out fishing activities with small and large fishing vessels in Mexican marine areas in the Northern Gulf of California and landing sites are established, as well as the use of monitoring systems for such fishing vessels, published on September 24th, 2020" published in the Official Gazette on 9th July 2021.

This text completes the set of regulatory requirements stipulated in the above-mentioned Agreement of September 2020.
